From Project Director

I am overwhelmed and excited for having accomplished a level 1 accreditation by HPCA. This is a collective achievement by all of us, and I also wish to acknowledge the contribution made by our supporters and donors. Thanks to all of you. We remain indebted to our volunteers who render a great service with minimal resources and without good salaries. Thanks to Hosanna Church who built us

the offices and continues to give our project logistical support. I am highly touched by the love that we receive from our South African white community. Thank you and May you please keep it up!!!!!! We also have a professional nursing sister Judith who comes once a week to visit Home Based Care patients, this is a great relief as it afford me time to do administrative duties. We remain however disappointed that to-date the government and the department of social development and welfare is not meaningfully recognizing our contribution to the community. Despite paying lip service to our work, they have not come forward to assist. Our diagnosis is that they are paralyzed by ineffective and incapacitated none caring officials on the ground.

My heart now is focused on the building of the children and multi-purpose shelter. We have the 22X11m steel structure an 120 bags of cement. The church has pledged the labor. We need more cement, stones, sand, windows and door frames to erect the structure. I wish to assure you that we are winning, lives are changed, sick people are getting better and the hungry are fed. Home Based Care (HBC)

We have retained all our 15 home based carers. Thanks to HPCA for giving each carer R450.00 stipend per month and Project LIMA gives R500.00 to each a month. So in total every Home Based Carer receives R950 per monthly. This is a huge improvement for carers who started zero salary per month in 2008



when HPCA started funding our development site. Our quality of care has improved tremendously with the

service of the additional Professional nurse and the referral of patients to our newly established multidisciplinary community service team.

Though self praise may not be a recommendation we are however, not shy to mention that our Home Based Care is second to none.

Our dream is to have a minibus that will solve our transport problem and accelerate service delivery, we are excited that we have

reached a level where people come to look for us in order to be helped. we

really think we are making a positive impact in the community. We have distributed surplus food to 8 other home based care and feeding schemes, that includes Oakley, Mkhuhlu etc. Our urgent needs are winter walking boots, wind breakers, umbrellas, budget for communication whilst meeting problem on site visit. We thank all the home based carers for doing a very good job and especially NOMSA MALANGANI who is an excellent team leader.



Orphans and Vulnerable Children (OVC)

We are extremely happy that we have enough food for the month of May and June. Our average number for April was 90 children per

day with highest attendance being 121. The children carers are doing a fantastic job though further training is needed.

The appearance and outlook of the new children has improved due to

proper eating and care. Generally the children are in a fine state, some of the children have lost their blankets due to uncaring relatives and are again in need of blankets and winter clothes. We hope that our promised shelter will be build before it becomes very cold.



Sewing projects

We are starting to realize our primary objective in the sewing project. The young orphan girls are acquiring skills and producing marketable items of good quality. We believe that it is a matter of time before we get market to buy all our products. This project will be self-sustainable. It has given the girls a good reason to look forward to coming to our center either than coming for food. Once we get a market e.g. lodges or hotels interested in helping us, we will then expand our product range. We are extremely hopeful of success in this project.



GARDEN PROJECT

Our food garden project is exemplary in our community; we have just finished harvesting chilies, which we sold to vegetable markets. We are enjoying spinach and selling some. Home based carers are also taking it to needy homes. We have 14 trained gardeners that are full time. Thanks to LIMA organization that has provided the workers for the project. The garden project manager together with the home based carers are now busy making vegetable gardens in the homes of patients recommended by the home based carers. We are looking forward to a great winter harvest.



Project literacy.

Our adult literacy project is not reopened ever since December 2009. We still hope to secure funding for teachers in order to proceed. We are however still proud of the 98 adults graduates who can now read and write.



This is one project that we cannot give up; literacy is a must for a community that is in poverty. We have call on a strategic planning session for this project on the end of May 2010
